About June Hennell MBE

June's husband Brian was diagnosed with Frontal Temporal Dementia on 4 February 2009, the day that the National Dementia Strategy was announced. In typical optimistic mode, the couple pleased to be 'on trend' for the first time in their lives.

This positivity led them to manage dementia well, writing booklets and articles including a chapter on living well with dementia for the 6th Annual Oxford Textbook of Old Age Psychiatry, plus supporting research and training at the University of Worcester, the University of Gloucestershire and University of the West of England.

The NHS Gloucestershire Living Well handbook inspired by, and produced by June and Brian has received world-wide acclaim and was adopted by authorities in Australia and New Zealand. They have spoken to audiences across the globe before Brian's fight for life ended in July 2013 but not before his legacy was cemented by the passionate talks he gave.

June works tirelessly with many organisations including co-chairing the carers advisory panel of The Royal Surgical Aid Society to develop a National Centre for Carers of Dementia.

June was awarded an MBE in 2016 for her services to dementia.
